<p>ONLINE APPLICATION Online Learning Agreement</p>	<p>The application process starts with filling the ON-LINE APPLICTION FORM, which includes application for the dormitory. The next step is filling the OLA. All necessary information on the application process is available on the university website: https://zagranica.wum.edu.pl/node/13468 NOTE: number of available places per course is limited. Therefore, you should be aware of possible necessity for modifications of your study program.</p>
<p>PROGRAM OF STUDY – Medicine</p>	<p>Detailed description of the medical curriculum can be found on the website: https://ed.wum.edu.pl/students/curriculum/ The university has long tradition of medical education in English. There is a 6-year medical program available for exchange students. Courses can be chosen from different years of study. In addition to the online application (see above) each exchange student creates his/her INDIVIDUAL TIMETABLE at the beginning of the semester. It is based on the English Medical Programme timetables which are sent by email to new exchange students before the beginning of each semester. The individual timetable is a major tool to arrange the final plan of study at the Medical University of Warsaw. Therefore, please be aware that your proposed study program is only provisionally approved → modifications of the learning agreement caused by overlaps, unavailability of courses are possible!</p>
<p>Language of instruction</p>	<p>The main language of instruction at MUW is Polish. It is our pleasure to host students speaking Polish, who can attend classes together with Polish students. We also offer programmes for Medicine and Dentistry in English, which are chosen by most exchange students. Although we do not require language certificates, we trust that the nominated students have the language command allowing them to participate in classes and exams without miscommunication problems.</p>
<p>Accommodation</p>	<p>Application for places in the university student house is made automatically after receiving the student application – separate housing application is not needed. ‘First come first served’ rule is applied based on the order of the online registration. The university provides fully furnished and equipped double rooms with kitchen and bathroom in the university residence - Dom Studenta BIS 2, ul. Karolkowa 84. The university will provide you with clues on searching for private accommodation in Warsaw in case of problems with getting a room in the student residence. There is no need to pay a deposit in advance. The first payment will be required upon arrival in cash. The next monthly rent should be paid to the bank account defined by the dormitory administration after check in. Accommodation cost ~ 1000 PLN / person / month (double room). <p>Insurance & Student Card</p>	<p>Each exchange student is obliged to possess health insurance. For EU/EFTA citizens European Health Insurance Card is required. The students from non-EU/EEA countries should purchase health insurance in their home country, before departure. According to state health regulations foreigners (except the EU/EEA citizens, see above) have to pay for a medical consultation. The cost is then reimbursed by the health insurance company. Apart from academic and public medical care system there is also a well-developed private sector. The costs of private medical care may be reimbursed if a student has purchased a health insurance policy in his/her country before departure. For non EU/EFTA citizens (e.g. Turkey) a private health insurance is necessary. Make sure that the agreement with insurance company ensures reimbursement of costs of treatment abroad.</p>

<p>Legalization of stay / Visa</p>	<p style="text-align: center;">EU/EEA citizens</p> <p>Registration of stay</p> <p>An EU citizen can enter Poland with his/her ID document (a valid travel document e.g. passport, or another document certifying his/her identity and citizenship).</p> <p>For stay up to 90 days no legalization of stay will be necessary. For stays exceeding 90 days, an EU citizen will have to register their stay.</p> <p>Temporary residence permits will be granted to EU citizens who have health insurance and sufficient resources to cover their expenses without needing social security support.</p> <p>Documents that have to be submitted by the student in order to obtain the residence permit:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • copy of the travel document (passport or other ID document) • health insurance document proving that costs of medical treatment in Poland will be covered by the insurance (sworn translation of the document) • declaration of possessing sufficient resources to cover the subsistence costs in Poland and sworn translation of document proving the resources (776 PLN for month plus costs of rental) <p>Citizens of the EEA countries are subject to the same conditions as the EU citizens.</p>

The citizens of Switzerland can enter Poland only on the basis of a valid passport.

Non-EU/EEA citizens

Visa

A citizen of a non-EU/EEA country can enter the territory of Poland on the basis of a valid travel document (passport) and a student visa (if required). A citizen of a non-EU country has to obtain the visa from the consulate of Poland in his/her country of residence. The short-term visa entitles to stay in Poland up to 3 months, the long-term visa – up to 1 year. The prolongation of visa in Poland is only possible in case of a force majeure or situation impossible to foresee while applying for the visa in the consulate.

It is therefore necessary to apply for a visa in a consulate for the whole planned period of stay in Poland.

Persons who have received a visa for the whole period of stay in Poland are not obliged to apply for a residence permit for their stay in Poland.
